VILLAGE OF GOLD RIVER

BYLAW NO. 737, 2022

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH THE BYLAW NOTICE AND DISPUTE ADJUDICATION SYSTEM

WHEREAS the Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act authorizes Council to designate bylaw contraventions that may be dealt with by bylaw notice;

AND WHEREAS the Community Charter including Sections 16, 17, 258, and 260 authorizes Council to allow for enforcement in relation to these matters;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Village of Gold River, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

1. TITLE

This bylaw may be cited as the "Bylaw Notice Enforcement Bylaw No. 737, 2022".

2. INTERPRETATION

In this bylaw, unless the context requires otherwise:

"Act" refers to the Local Government Bylaw Notice Enforcement Act;

"Registry" refers to the Dispute Adjudication Registry System or DARS established with the City of Nanaimo and other municipalities;

"Village" refers to the Village of Gold River.

3. TERMS

3.1. The terms in this bylaw have the same meaning as the terms defined in the Act.

4. BYLAW CONTRAVENTIONS

- 4.1. The bylaw contraventions designated in Schedule "A" may be dealt with by bylaw notice as set out in this bylaw or by municipal ticket information as per the Village of Gold River Municipal Ticket Information Bylaw No. 741, 2022.
- 4.2. Each day an offence continues constitutes a separate offence.

5. APPLICATION

- 5.1. This bylaw applies to those contraventions included in the following bylaws as enacted by the Village of Gold River:
 - a. Animal Control and Pound Bylaw No. 736, 2022
 - b. Business Licence Bylaw No. 735, 2021
 - c. Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 734, 2021
 - d. Noise Control Bylaw No. 665, 2008
 - e. Open Fire Regulation Bylaw No. 718, 2019

- f. Park Use Bylaw No. 740, 2022
- g. Street and Traffic Bylaw No. 667, 2008
- h. Unsightly Premise Bylaw No. 666, 2008

6. OFFENCE AND PENALTY

- 6.1. The penalty for a contravention referred to in Schedule "A" is as follows:
 - 6.1.1. Subject to subsection 6.1.2. and 6.1.3., the penalty amount is set out in column A1 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this bylaw.
 - 6.1.2. If payment is received by the Village within 14 days, or 30 days for offences in the Street and Traffic Bylaw No. 667, 2008, of the person receiving or being presumed to have received the notice, will be charged the Early Payment Fee set out in column A2 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this bylaw.
 - 6.1.3. If more than 30 days have lapsed after the person has received or is presumed to have received the bylaw notice, they will be subject to a late payment surcharge in addition to the penalty under subsection 6.1.1., the sum of which is the Late Payment Fee set out in column A3 of Schedule "A", as attached to and forming part of this bylaw.

7. PERIOD FOR PAYING A DISPUTED NOTICE

- 7.1. A person who receives a bylaw notice must, within 14 days of the date on which the person received or is presumed to have received the bylaw offence notice:
 - 7.1.1. Pay the penalty in any manner prescribed on the reverse side of the bylaw offence notice, or
 - 7.1.2. Request dispute adjudication by completing the form on the reverse side of the bylaw offence notice and delivering it to the Registry Office, PO Box 610, 499 Muchalat Drive, Gold River, BC V0P 1G0.
- 7.2. A person may pay the indicated penalty after 14 days of receiving the bylaw offence notice, subject to the applicable surcharge for late payment in accordance with subsection 6.1.3, but no person may dispute the bylaw offence notice after 14 days of receiving the bylaw offence notice.
- 7.3. Where a person was not served personally with a bylaw offence notice and advises the Village, in accordance with the requirements of Section 25 of the Act, that they did not receive a copy of the original bylaw offence notice, the time limits for responding to a bylaw offence notice under Section 6.1 and 7.1 of this bylaw does not begin until a copy of the bylaw offence notice is redelivered to them in accordance with the Act.

8. BYLAW NOTICE DISPUTE ADJUDICATION REGISTRY

- 8.1. The Registry is established as a bylaw notice dispute adjudication system in accordance with the Act to resolve disputes in relation to bylaw notices.
- 8.2. The civic address of the Registry is the Service and Resource Centre, City of Nanaimo, 411 Dunsmuir Street, Nanaimo, BC V9R 5J6.

8.3. Every person who is unsuccessful in a dispute adjudication in relation to a bylaw offence notice or a compliance agreement under the dispute adjudication system established under this section must pay the Village an additional fee of \$25 for the purpose of the Village recovering partial costs of administration of the adjudication system.

9. SCREENING OFFICERS

- 9.1. The position of Screening Officer is hereby established.
- 9.2. The positions designated as Screening Officers include the Village's Chief Administrative Officer, Corporate Officer, and Bylaw Enforcement Officers.

10. POWERS, DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF SCREENING OFFICERS

- 10.1. The powers, duties and functions of Screening Officers are as set out in the Act and include the following powers:
 - 10.1.1. Where requested by the person against whom a contravention is alleged, a screening officer will communicate the following:
 - a. information respecting the nature of the contravention;
 - b. the provision of the bylaw contravened;
 - c. the facts on which the contravention allegation is based;
 - d. the penalty for a contravention;
 - e. the opportunity to enter into a compliance agreement if applicable;
 - f. the opportunity to proceed to the bylaw notice dispute adjudication system; And,
 - g. the fee or fees payable in relation to the bylaw notice enforcement process.
 - 10.1.2. To communicate with any or all of the following for the purposes of performing their functions under this bylaw or the Act:
 - a. the person against whom a contravention is alleged or their representative;
 - b. the officer issuing the notice;
 - c. the complainant or their representative;
 - d. Village staff and records regarding the disputant's history of bylaw compliance.
 - 10.1.3. To prepare and enter into compliance agreements under the Act with persons who dispute bylaw notices, including to establish terms and conditions for compliance that the Screening Officer considers necessary or advisable, including time periods for payment of penalties and compliance with the bylaw;
 - 10.1.4. To provide for payment of a reduced penalty if a compliance agreement is entered into, as provided in column A4 of Schedule "A"; and
 - 10.1.5. To cancel bylaw offence notices in accordance with the Act or Village policies and guidelines.
- 10.2. The bylaw contraventions in relation to which a Screening Officer may enter into a compliance agreement are indicated in column A4 of Schedule "A".
- 10.3. The maximum duration of a compliance agreement is one year.

10.4. Where a compliance agreement is entered into, the penalty payable for the offence shall be reduced to one half of the penalty as listed in column A1 of Schedule "A" of this bylaw.

11. BYLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

- 11.1. Persons acting as any of the following are hereby designated as Bylaw Enforcement Officers for the purposes of this bylaw and the Act:
 - 11.1.1. Special constables, officers, members or constables of:
 - a. The provincial police force as defined in Section 1 of the Police Act, or
 - b. A municipal police force:
 - Members of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police; 11.1.2.
 - 11.1.3. The Village's Corporate Officer and their Deputy;
 - 11.1.4. The Local Assistant to the Fire Commissioner; And,
 - 11.1.5. Bylaw enforcement officers, building inspectors, animal control officers or other persons acting in another capacity on behalf of the Village for the purpose of enforcement of one or more of its bylaws.

12. SEVERABILITY

12.1. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this bylaw is for any reason found invalid by decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw.

13. FORM OF BYLAW NOTICE

13.1. The Village may from time to time provide for the form or forms of the bylaw offence notice, provided the bylaw offence notice complies with Section 4 of this Act.
